The plan should begin with the vulnerable populations. Next, the essential workers at greatest risk of infection, such as health care workers and first responders and other essential workers who cannot work from home, such as construction workers, should g follow. While the construction industry has gone to great lengths to protect its workers from the coronavirus, and it has been very largely successful, its workers merit priority over other essential workers who have the option of working remotely.

3. Ensure that Vaccination Distributions Do Not Lead to Needless Economic Disruptions.

AGC believes that both the public and public officials will require assurance that the distribution of vaccines will be rational, orderly and relatively **Qtheo**rwise, they may overreact to the news that vaccines are available. AGC perceives a risk that public officials may demand or require even essential businesses to shut down until the vaccines are widely distributed. Such shutdowns would inflict additiona hardships on countless workers and their families. And they would be in complete disregard of the widespread safety protocols that have been put in place to allow essential economic activity to continue, safely, during the pandemic. A thoughtful and **repre**sive plan for the nationwide distribution of vaccines would mitigate the risk of such disruptions and any need for federal preemption of state or local laws.

The federal government and the private sector have gone to great lengths to facilitateptiment of multiple vaccine candidates that will, hopefully, soon be approved and made available. The tremendous potential for this hard work and innovation to turn the country around will not, however, be realized if the subsequent distribution of views is wholly delegated to state and local governments. There is the real potential that conflicting and confusing priorities at the state and local level will undermine the distribution process.
